DISCUSSION POINT ONE: HOW ABOUT A MARRIAGE CONTRACT?

Remember the fact that we, the church, are the Bride of Christ?

See 2 Corinthians 11:2 and Ephesians 5:25-27.

How come Jesus has not given us a marriage contract?

What is the difference between a contract and a promise?

Look at Gal. 3:15-18.

God promised to bless the entire world though the descendent of Abraham (Jesus).

Look at Genesis 22:17-18.

Note that in Gen. 22:17, the first use of the word "seed" is obviously plural, but the second time God states "...and your seed shall possess the gate of his enemies."

Most English language translations miss the point God was making. They use the words " shall possess the gate of <u>their</u> enemies", but the original language is singular, "<u>his</u> enemies".

Note how the Apostle catches that in Gal. 3:16.

Since God made a <u>promise</u>, what contract agreement is there with us?

Can any contract enforce agape love? (unconditional love?)

If God loves me, what can I do to earn a relationship with Him?

What does verse 19 say about the (Mosaic) Law being a contract. What is the purpose of a mediator in contract negotiations.

Now look at v. 20. Did God's <u>promise</u> involve a negotiation? or was it unilateral?

What mediator is required to make a loving, unconditional promise?

NOTE: Do not get confused here with Jesus being the Mediator between God and Man (1 Tim. 2:5). That is not the point of the Galatians passage.

Jesus is not the mediator of a promise - He IS the promise.

#### DISCUSSION POINT TWO: SO, WHY DID GOD GIVE THE LAW?

What does Gal. 3:21 say about the Law?

Is the Law bad?

Does it teach something that disagrees with God's love?

What did God intend the Law to do? Read Gal. 3:22-24.

Think of some examples, like: "You shall not covet."

How does the Law keep us from feeling self-righteous?

What does Gal. 3:24 say about the purpose of the Law?

### • DISCUSSION POINT THREE: SO, I HAVE SINNED, NOW WHAT?

What is the point of Gal. 3:26?

What is the role of "faith" (trust)?

How does this explain v. 25?

If you have the opportunity to explain forgiveness of sin to a friend, what verses about faith would you use? (By the way, try a Google search.) How about Colossians 1:13-14, or Eph. 1:7?

What are some of God's promises about being forgiven? Consider Acts 10:43 or Rom. 6:23. What are some others?

### • FOR MEDITATION: HOW DOES GOD EXPECT ME TO LIVE MY LIFE?

Think on, ponder, Gal. 3:26-29.

What are some of the ideas here about God's family?

How about if I just want to live my own life without relating to others?

How does divisiveness fit into the Christian life?

In what ways do I need to change with God's help?

#### • FOR PRAYER:
