Do you want to feel free of worries and to have a feeling of contentment?

This is ours when we acknowledge that God owns all things, and when we trust His promise to provide.

• <u>DISCUSSION POINT ONE: GOD OWNS EVERYTHING – I am a steward</u> of His possessions.

Mine. Mine...MINE!!!

Does that remind you of a two-year-old?

Yet how often do we really think in those terms?

Job was an amazing man. Job had far more riches than just about anyone you or I will ever know.

Yet look at his perspective: Job 1:21.

If you spent your "blood, sweat and tears" building something (and assuming that you did not take out a loan to do that) who is the owner?

Now think about Who owns this entire universe!

Look at John 1:1-5, especially v. 3.

Compare Col. 1:15-17.

Break down the statements in v. 16. What was Jesus' role in building this world?

Look carefully at v. 17. What does that say ...

- 1) about Jesus, compared to John 8:58, John 17:5 and Rev. 22:13?
- 2) about Jesus' role in our physical universe today?

Who owns the very materials on which you spent that "blood, sweat and tears"?

Who actually owns YOU?

What does all this, along with 1 Chron. 29:10-16, say about my responsibility?

What does this say about my sense of ownership?

How do our financial decisions relate to our spiritual life?

How can contentment result from giving up control?

• <u>DISCUSSION POINT TWO: GOD PROMISES TO PROVIDE MY NEEDS – I can serve him without worry.</u>

Anxiety ---- Worry!

See how many times the idea of anxiety is mentioned in Matt. 6:25-34.

How does the kind of trust talked about here relate to feeling SAFE?

If God already knows what we <u>need</u>, and if God really cares about <u>me</u>, then what kind of freedom does that give me?

Does God have a daily plan for me? Review Eph. 2:10.

How does trusting Him for my needs relate to that?

What about actually feeling contented in this messed up world? What does 1 Tim. 6:6-10 say about this?

• LET'S SHARE OUR EXPERIENCES.

Many of us in this room have seen God answer and provide.

What are some of these experiences?

Let's share them with our group.
