KEY TRUTH:

OUR CHURCH FAMILY IS MOST EFFECTIVELY BUILT UP WHEN WE MINISTER OUR GRACE-GIFTS IN AN ORDERLY, PEACEFUL MANNER.

DISCUSSION POINT ONE: REVIEW – WHY DO THE GIFTS EXIST?

Look at the last sentence in 1 Cor. 14:26.

What word does your Bible use, "for edification"? "edifying"? "building up"? "strengthening"?

Note that the actual word the Apostle Paul used was "constructing".

In other words, the image is that of building a house.

If we were given grace-gifts for that purpose, how does that work out in our individual lives?

How does that work out in our church body?

• DISCUSSION POINT TWO: CHAOS....(OR NOT!).

Have you ever been part of a project work group where no one was in charge?

Have you ever heard of the medical term "fibrillation"? That is where muscle fibers in the heart all work very hard....at accomplishing <u>nothing!</u> Sometimes it takes a shock to get them to work together to pump blood. Relate that to our life as the Body of Christ.

• <u>DISCUSSION POINT THREE: COME PREPARED TO MINISTER IN AN</u> ORDERLY MANNER.

As we read 1 Cor. 14:26-33a, let's think about what v.33a says and how that applies.

What opportunities for chaos were there in this setting?

Imagine: You are convinced that God has put a word of encouragement in your mind, but Jack just keeps on talking and talking!

You feel like interrupting him. After all, your message is just as important as his.

Break down this passage, describing what you understand to be said.

In addition to our activities in church, since God intends us to be orderly, how does that apply to other areas of our lives?

• DISCUSSION POINT FOUR: THE ROLES OF MEN AND WOMEN.

NOTE: These next verses have NOTHING to do with a person's relative value.

The second half of verse 33 is actually the first part of verse 34. (Remember that chapter and verse divisions did not exist in the original writings.)

Read 1 Cor. 14:33b-36.

What is the setting here What gatherings are in view?

Back to verses 26-33a, what is the context?

Did a prophet or a tongues speaker declare a message from God, or personal opinion?

Have any of you ever been in a situation where you have heard, "Let's get together and talk about this later."? The idea being that explaining the issue at that time would be disruptive.

Now look at 1 Timothy 2:8-15.

How do verses 12-14 clarify the general <u>roles</u> of men and women? Is there any indication of <u>relative value</u> here?

For illustration: In both the airline industry and the U.S. Navy, one person is placed in command of a vehicle. The "second-incommand" is REQUIRED to correct the captain when the captain makes a mistake. A clear line of authority in decision making is essential to safety, but that has nothing to do with who is more valuable.

As an airline captain, I have often had co-pilots who were more experienced in that particular aircraft than I was, and I learned a lot from them.

So, what IS God's role for each of us?

• FOR MEDITATION AT HOME:

Think about 1 Timothy 2:15.

Let it sink in that God brought the Redeemer to Earth through a woman.

Read Genesis 3:15 and note the source of Satan's ultimate destruction.

Look at Acts 18:26, Romans 16:1-7, Phil. 4:2-3 and 1 Tim. 1:5. Note the deep respect for women.

Men: Think seriously about Eph. 5:25-33. Do you truly love your wife sacrificially, <u>just like Jesus loved the church and gave Himself for her?</u> If that is not your situation, what are you going to do about it?

THIS WEEK:

1. Kyrgyzstan:

Praise God - Marat Niyazaliev has been released from prison!!

Marat is well-known in his community for his Christian beliefs and for the small church he leads there. He has been suffering in an investigative prison since September 2015.

Marat is so well respected that he was chosen to manage the village's water supply.

As a believer, he administered the water system with integrity and would not let an influential Muslim man continue to steal water from the city.

To extract revenge, the Muslim man conspired with others to accuse Marat of molesting a young girl.

2. China:

Pastor Han was put at the top of a North Korean hit list. He was murdered near the North Korean border.

Pray for his wife and for courageous workers who are risking their lives to get the gospel into North Korea.

3. North Korea:

It was 10 p.m. as their car drove slowly down a dirt road along the Chinese border with North Korea. The driver, a VOM field worker, had turned off the headlights to reduce the possibility of being spotted by Chinese or North Korean border guards. Only the faint light of the moon and stars lit their way.

After arriving at a small house, they walked quickly from the vehicle to the house so curious neighbors wouldn't see them, especially the foreigner.

When they stepped inside, their eyes were immediately drawn to a young man sitting in front of a small television watching the JESUS film. He was a North Korean who had crossed the river into China for discipleship training. As soon as he was finished watching the film, he would be making the dangerous journey back home to North Korea.

To avoid further endangering the young man and the home owners, the visitors left after a brief meeting, returning the same way they had come.

As they drove back down the dirt road with their headlights off, one of the visitors prayed fervently for the young man who would be making the risky trip back home with his new knowledge of the gospel.

Anyone caught leaving North Korea illegally, or without successfully bribing officials, is arrested or shot.
